The annual Hinamatsuri, or Girls Dav. will be held at the DIA venues on Sunday, March 3, 2024.

In 2013, DIA bankrupted due to the city of Detroit's financial collapse. In 2014. after receiving a court ruling (Grand Bargain) that wrote off a huge amount of debt by collecting a large amount of donations, the DIA began to move the path of revitalization. This campaign also attracted a huge donation of \$3.2 million from Japanese companies and the Japanese community. Then DIA began to be operated from being owned by the city to become an independent nonprofit corporation.

We have put a lot of effort into putting together a program for the annual Hinamatsuri Festival in order to introduce Japanese culture at DIA and to attract as many people as possible to come to DIA. For "Hinamatsuri 2024" at DIA, which will celebrate its 10th anniversary since the year of DIA's rebirth, we are planning to have more people participate in the program than ever before. On the top of this, we will show the Friendship Dolls story by Kami-shibai (Storytelling with paper slides) that may help understanding the Friendship Dolls Exhibition.
